Ordinance No. 10 20 16

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR TO APPLY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL TRAVEL PLAN PROJECT FUNDS, AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has set aside monies for Safe Routes to School Projects through the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, Local Public Agencies, including the City of Norwood, can apply for these monies and be selected for funding by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the School Travel Plan is a transportation activity eligible to receive federal funding; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by Council for the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION ONE: The Service-Safety Director of the City of Norwood, is hereby empowered on behalf of the City of Norwood to prepare and execute an application for SRTS funds for the School Travel Plan and to submit the application to the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

SECTION TWO: The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$400,000.00, of which the City of Norwood, if awarded the funds, further agrees to pay One Hundred Percent (100%) of the construction cost over and above the maximum amount provided by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation.

SECTION THREE: Upon completion of the described Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the City of Norwood shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the described Project in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws, including, but not limited to, 23 USC 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the described Project; (3) if necessary, maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) if necessary, hold the right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION FOUR: If the application is approved for the funding, the Service-Safety Director of the City of Norwood is hereby empowered on behalf of the City of Norwood to enter into a contract with the Director of the Ohio Department of Transportation necessary to complete the above described project.




