

Ordinance No. 14 20 16

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE-SAFETY TO ENTER INTO AN EQUIPMENT LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT UNDER THE STATE BID PURCHASE PROGRAM WITH MOTOROLA SOLUTIONS, INC. FOR POLICE AND FIRE RADIOS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the radios used by the City of Norwood Police and Fire Divisions are nearing the end of their useful lives and will require replacement in the near future; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to authorize the Service-Safety Director to enter an equipment lease-purchase agreement substantially similar to that presented to Council at its March 22, 2016 meeting for new radios for the Police and Fire Divisions; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. The Council of the City of Norwood has determined that a true and very real need exists for the acquisition of the Equipment and other personal property described in the Lease-Purchase Agreement between the City of Norwood and Motorola Solutions, Inc.

SECTION 2. The Council of the City of Norwood has determined that the Lease-Purchase Agreement, substantially in the form presented at the meeting of Council on March 22, 2016, is in the best interests of the City for the acquisition of such Equipment and other personal property, and the Director of Public Service-Safety is hereby authorized to enter into a contract under the State Bid Purchase Program, in accordance with specifications filed in the office of the Director of Public Service-Safety and/or the Auditor's Office, with Motorola Solutions, Inc. for the lease of radio equipment described in "Exhibit A" for use by the Norwood Police and Fire Divisions. The costs of the radio equipment is as follows:

SECTION 3. The signatures referenced in the Lease-Purchase Agreement from the designated individuals for the Council of the City of Norwood evidence the adoption by Council of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: The City Auditor is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer is authorized to pay warrants in the amounts and according to the schedule, as outlined in the attached "Exhibit A," for the lease of the aforementioned radio equipment for the foregoing purposes out of **GENERAL FUND 01**, beginning in 2017.

SECTION 5. The Auditor is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the City, any and all financing agreements to obtain financing for the lease of the aforementioned radio equipment.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and

general welfare and shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage. The reason for said emergency is the need to proceed forthwith to lock in the favorable terms available until March 25, 2016.
